Brain Based Parenting - From Mistrust to Trust A Day with Dan Hughes and Jon Baylin

Dan Hughes, Ph.D. is a clinical psychologist

with a limited practice in Annville, PA near Philadelphia. He founded and developed DDP, the treatment of children who have experienced abuse and neglect and demonstrate ongoing problems related to attachment and trauma. This treatment occurs in a family setting and the treatment model has expanded to become a general model of family treatment. He has conducted seminars, workshops, and spoken at conferences throughout the US, Europe, Canada, and Australia for the past 17 years. He is also engaged in extensive training with certification of therapists in his treatment model, along with ongoing consultation to various agencies and professionals. Dan is the author of many books and articles. These include Building the Bonds of Attachment (2nd Ed.) 2006, Attachment-Focused Parenting (2009), Attachment-Focused Family Therapy Workbook (2011) and, with Jon Baylin, Brain-Based Parenting (2012). Dan can be contacted at: dhughes202@comcast.net His website is www.danielhughes.org Dr Jon Baylin received his doctorate in clinical psychology from Peabody College of Vanderbilt University in 1981. He has been working in the mental health field for 35 years. For the past fifteen years, while continuing his clinical practice, he has immersed himself in the study of neuroscience and in teaching mental health practitioners about the brain. He

has given numerous workshops for mental health professionals on "Putting the Brain in Therapy." Several years ago, Dr. Baylin began a collaborative relationship with Daniel Hughes, a leader in the field of attachment-focused therapy. Their book, Brain Based Parenting, was released by Norton Press in the spring of 2012 as part of the Norton series on Interpersonal Neurobiology edited by Daniel Siegel, MD. They are currently working on a second book to be published by Norton which may be available in the early spring focusing on the neurobiology of change in attachment-focused therapy. Dr. Baylin has been presenting internationally for several years and has delivered keynote sessions at conferences both abroad and in the USA.

Dr Dan Hughes and Dr Jon Baylin from the US have developed a brain-based approach to interventions with children who have been under- or badly nurtured. Dan and Jon will share their knowledge with caregivers and professionals working with these children. They will describe their concepts of 'blocked trust' and 'blocked care'; look at ways to help under-nurtured children learn to trust trustworthy people; and take us through the processes that help children recover from blocked trust and reawaken their ability to seek comfort and experience the joy of good connections. The presenters will also discuss ways to strengthen your ability to be a trust builder.
