Attachment is a lifelong aspect in human relationships but the developmental needs of adolescents often cause a conflict at this age, particularly for young people who have experienced early relational trauma. This can leave those caring for them very confused by the young person's behaviour and uncertain how best to support them.

This training will look both at attachment in adolescents and the developmental impact which can affect the bonds between young people and their carers, and aims to provide practical ideas of how to manage this.
