## Who we are

"PAC-UK is the country's largest independent Adoption Support Agency. Our vision is that all those affected by adoption, Special Guardianship and other forms of permanent care are supported and enabled to live their lives to the full. We have built our expertise over a 30 year period, starting out as Post-Adoption Centre in 1986. In recent years we have combined with other specialist providers – After Adoption Yorkshire and Adoption UK – to produce a more robust service with a wider reach and a more comprehensive range of activities."

#### We deliver services to ALL those affected by the complexities of adoption and permanent care:

- Adoptive and permanent-placement families, and those considering adoption or special guardianship
- Adopted and permanent placement children both in their families and in their school setting
- Young people and adults who were adopted or permanently placed as children
- Birth parents and other birth relatives
- Education staff who work with adopted and permanent-placement children
- Professionals (mainly social workers) who work with these groups

#### What we do

- We teach therapeutic parenting skills to mums and dads struggling to cope
- We help adopted and permanent placement children understand their complex life histories
- We support these vulnerable families to stay together and improve bonds of attachment
- We work with teachers to improve the school life of these traumatised children
- We offer independent support to the vulnerable birth families who have 'lost' their children
- We give specialist advice and training to adoption social workers and other professionals

### Adult Counselling

Specialist advice and counselling for adopted adults, parents and carers:

- 3,937 appointments held with 1,086 individuals
- 85% registered a high level of satisfaction with the sensitivity with which their issue was handled
- 80% registered a high level of satisfaction with the service

### **Child & Family Services**

#### Providing specialist therapeutic support for children and families

All families feeding back about the service registered improvement in their own capacity to be consistent and in their child's behaviours. Consistently over 88% registered improvement in these further areas:

- Capacity to manage their own emotions
- Capacity of child to manage own emotions and express their feelings
- Improved family life
- Competence as a therapeutic parent

## Child to Parent Violence (CPV) Project

In 2016/17 we received grant funding from the DfE to provide extra support to families struggling with child-to-parent violence.

"Our aim is to provide adoptive parents with the knowledge, skills and strategies to increase their parental presence and be confident in de-escalating conflict. Group workshops are run on an ongoing basis." - Jo Mitchell, CPV Project Lead

71 parents attended four CPV groups – receiving 34 hours of specialist input.

## Adopted Teens Identity (AT-iD) Project

"I joined AT-iD because I wanted to find more people who were adopted so I wouldn't feel alone or isolated." – Adopted Teen

"The project aims to give a voice to adopted teenagers by providing them with a safe and secure way to discuss problems and issues with their peers or project workers. All our young people 'make a difference', either by supporting each other or, via our Youth Council, influencing professionals and policy-makers." - Tanya Killick, Project Lead

30 young people from 15 local authorities participated in an online chat forum for adopted young people and attended 9 activity days. They produced a film about being adopted, 'Voices', which was given a public screening and also sent to the DfE, Virtual Schools, local authorities and VAAs, receiving professional acclaim.

## Adopted Teens Identity (AT-iD) Project

"If you want to know how young people in care feel, it's not through an evaluation form, not through a system of committees. Get them to write poetry." - Lemn Sissay, 2015

This poem was written by a member of the AT-iD group, aged 13:

I am adopted. I am one of millions, Hundreds, thousands, Maybe even billions. It can make you feel sad or happy; Or more complex feelings, Like withdrawn or snappy. Our stories are all different, They're never set in a straight line. Sometimes parents just can't care for us, Are hurt, or committed crime. When you are adopted, People act as if you are different. They talk behind your back, And give you different treatment. When you are adopted, Life is full of laughter. But then you look back and think, "Have I A happy ever after?" Sometimes we get bullied, And this is really hard. None of it's your fault, But you take it to heart. People don't understand, That that's too close to home; You start to isolate yourself, To be safe, is to be alone.

Some people build walls, Big, strong, safe ones. Huge and thick; They weigh tons and tons. But these walls, you see, Aren't to keep people out. They're to see who cares, To knock them about. A few people I know, Have knocked my wall down. They are the people, Who will never, ever let me down. Do you know someone who has built a wall? How big is the wall? Is it ever so tall? Will you knock down the wall, Give your heart as a home? To make sure that person, Is never alone? We are not so different, You and me. I am human, I have feelings, Can't you see? Just because I'm adopted, Doesn't mean I'm different. I'm just like any other person, Please, don't give me different treatment.



## **Training Service**

An annual programme of training days for families and professionals, delivered by experts in the field.

### **Peer Services**

PAC-UK's Peer Services have been delivered in partnership with Adoption UK (AUK) since October 2016.

# Conferences, celebrations, and awards!

### Brain-Based Parenting Conference a Resounding Success

The PAC-UK and Adoption UK Brain Based Parenting conference, which took place in Leeds in April 2016, was a huge success. The conference was the first exciting collaboration between PAC-UK and Adoption UK and led by celebrated Clinical Psychologist Dan Hughes Ph.D. and Jon Baylin Ph.D.

The event, which was attended by over 300 delegates, provided adoptive parents and professionals with an opportunity to hear presentations and get hands-on training on a brain based approach to help children who have experienced neglect and trauma.



### PAC-UK Reflects on Adoption: Living Life to the Full Conference and the Future of Post-Adoption Support

In November 2016, PAC-UK and The Big Lottery Grant came together to host the Adoption: Living Life to the Full conference, an event designed to give adoptive families, carers and other professionals a platform to share their experiences and hopes for the future of postadoption support.

The conference, which attracted over 100 attendees, included presentations from leading industry experts on research and developments in practical support, and provided an opportunity for adoptive parents to discuss their personal journeys, and how they would like to see support services develop nationwide.

## 2<u>016/17</u>

Our government and local authority income is up to £1,215,273 (from £1,148,467 in 2015/16) while fees have increased to £1,058,216 (from £686,563)

Income from grants and foundations increased by 3% to **£305,856** and we received **£19,369** in donations and gifts.

Our income was spent across our core services in a similar pattern to previous years including the continued rapid growth in the education service at **£458,522** compared to **£284,889** last year.
