Non Violent Resistance - NVR 10 Weekly Group Sessions for

Special Guardians

of Children and Young People presenting Challenging, Destructive and Violent Behaviour

* Venue for 9 October, 6 and 13 November group is Family Action, Wharf Studios, Wharf Road, N1 7GR

Group structure:

- 10 weekly 3 hour groups = 30 hours of contact time per participant
- 6 diarised 2 hour follow-up support groups (over 6 months) = 12 hours of contact time per participant
- Diarised telephone sessions = 4 hours of contact time per participant

Total hours of contact time per participant = 46 hours

To get the most out of the group, participants need to attend in full. For two parent families it is most beneficial to attend together where possible.

Participants will learn to:

- Take a firm stance against violence
- Hold back from physical or verbal violence
- Increase positive presence in your child's life
- De-escalate conflicts
- Break the cycle of shame and silence
- Make changes in relating to your child in the long term
- Reduce distress for parent and child
- Feel more in control
- Recruit and use supporters
- Enjoy the benefits of being part of a group

The facilitators

Dawn Oliver, NVR-UK Practitioner and Therapeutic Parent Coach. Dawn has an MSc in Psychology (Child Development). She has worked in charities and schools supporting children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) and their parents. She delivers NVR training to those parents. Dawn has theoretical knowledge and personal experience in the fields of autism, adoption and person-centred approaches. She is a mother to 4 children, one of whom is on the autistic spectrum and one is adopted. She co-facilitates trainings for special guardians and adoptive parents run by PAC-UK.

Joanna Parker, UKCP registered Integrative Arts Psychotherapist MA, qualified supervisor and trainer. Joanna has worked clinically with both adults and children in a range of settings for the past fifteen years. Joanna was the Young Oasis Lead for a ten year period, managing a multi-disciplinary team supporting families impacted by drug or alcohol misuse. Joanna joined the Child and family team at PAC-UK in December 2019, works therapeutically with families integrating the principles of Dyadic Developmental Psychotherapy (DDP) and Theraplay into her practice. Joanna has been involved with NVR groups since joining PAC-UK.
