Denise and Zach will introduce their work on the Great Behaviour Breakdown (GBB) parenting model in the UK and Ireland, as well as their exciting new "Training the Trainers" GBB programme. They will present a 'love-based', tried and tested toolbox of techniques for relationship-based parenting that works with children presenting a range of challenging behaviours – too good to be true? Denise and Zach will consider the application of these tools when parenting children affected by Trauma, Attachment Disruption, ASD, ADHD and other mental health difficulties.
