Sue Dromey, NVR-UK Accredited Practitioner / Integrative Child Psychotherapist, has worked in the field of fostering and adoption for 40 years as an Integrative Child Psychotherapist, drama-therapist, trainer, Guardian ad Litem and social worker. She has been the Practice Manager for PAC-UK's Child and Family Service for 20 years. Sue has a special interest in therapeutic work, which addresses trauma in both children and their parents and integrating this with the principles of NVR. She is part of the team who has developed the PAC-UK Child to Parent Violence Project under a DfE grant. Sue works with trauma using EMDR (Eye Movement Desensitisation Reprocessing) AIT (Advanced Integrative Therapy) EFT (Emotional Freedom Technique) as well as creative therapies.

Dawn Oliver, NVR UK Accredited Practitioner and NVR Parent Graduate – who has 'been there and got the t-shirt.' Dawn has an MSc in Psychology (Child Development) and languages (BA Hons Modern Languages) background. She has worked in charities and schools supporting children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) and their parents. Dawn has theoretical knowledge and personal experience in the fields of autism, adoption and person-centred approaches. She is a mum to four children, one of whom is on the autistic spectrum and another who is adopted. Dawn delivers training to parents of children with SEND in schools and to professionals wishing to train in NVR. Dawn co-facilitates groups run by PAC-UK for adoptive parents/special guardians/foster carers.
