The facilitators

Joanna Parker is a UKCP registered Integrative Arts Psychotherapist MA, qualified supervisor and trainer. She has worked clinically with both adults and children in a range of settings for the past fifteen years. Joanna was the Young Oasis Lead for a ten-year period, managing a multi-disciplinary team supporting families impacted by drug or alcohol misuse. Joanna joined the Child and family team at PAC-UK in December 2018; she works therapeutically with families integrating the principles of Dyadic Developmental Psychotherapy (DDP) and Theraplay into her practice. Joanna has been involved with NVR groups since joining PAC-UK and has completed her level 2 NVR training for professionals.

Adrian Perks is an adoptive parent and a qualified Integrative Child and Adolescent Counsellor. In PAC-UK he supports adoptive parents and special guardians through individual and couples counselling sessions, the Enhancing Adoptive Parenting programme (EAP) and with NVR, having completed his level 1 NVR training for professionals. Adrian also works in primary and secondary schools as a counsellor and therapy group facilitator.

Participants have found it invaluable to have parent Facilitators with lived experience (been there and got the t-shirt) as part of the NVR team.

Sylvia is a Parent Graduate of a 10-week NVR group 2016. She retired from a career as a special needs teacher. She has completed her Level Two NVR course, training for professional and parent graduates. She and her husband adopted their two children at the ages of 8 & 6. They are now young adults and having travelled a rocky road, with support over the years, from personal and professional people in their lives, they are doing very well. The NVR course Sylvia and her husband took part in, while quite late in their adoption journey, was so useful in many ways, and inspired her to do more, hoping others can benefit from it earlier. Adoption has not been an easy journey for the family, and has involved much resilience, therapy, destruction, joy, heartache, patience, exclusion, laughter, frustration, money, support, faith and love.
